HOSANNA!

“Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; hosanna in the highest” (Matthew 21:9). With these words the Church enters the holiest of weeks, commemorating the passion, death, and resurrection of Christ. When the people of Jerusalem cried out with their “hosannas,” they were using an ancient Hebrew shout of acclamation that meant “Pray, save us.” The king to whom they were shouting eventually would save them, but in a way that would be far from what they expected. Salvation would come from the wood of the cross as Jesus hung there to bring freedom from sin and life through death, opening the gates of heaven for all who put their faith and trust in him.—Copyright © J. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Most Christians today receive a bunch of palm fronds, olive branches, pussy willow, or forsythia (a relative of the olive) to carry in procession and to bear home in blessing. Some even offer sprigs of palm or other branches as a gesture of peace to those they have offended. The desire is to make a clean sweep of your spiritual house before the Easter feast. Accepting the branch is a token of the bearer's willingness to journey with the Church through a grateful remembrance of Jesus Christ's passion, death, and life-giving resurrection. Traditionally, the plants associated with today's feast are planted in cemeteries as a sign of Christ's victory over death and the promise of new life. The joy of this day's opening procession soon gives way to a solemn reading of the Passion, this year according to Matthew. The ritual is meant not only to strengthen us to hear this account, but to stir us up to accompany the Church on this journey through Holy Week. First Communion Celebrations, scheduled for this May, are now postponed until August 2020. Dates and times for August will be available soon.

We are deeply saddened by the loss of our dear sister in Christ, Camilla Gambirasio (87) who entered in the embrace of the Heavenly Father on Friday March 27, 2020. She was suffering from dementia disease and in December 2017 she went back to Bergamo, Italy. She breathed her last breath in the presence of the sisters of her religious Community.



Sr. Camilla Gambirasio (Virginia) was born on February 4, 1933, Osio Sotto, Italy, to the parents of the God fearing family of Camillo and Florinda. She is preceded by her parents and two siblings – Giuseppe, Renato and survived by her sister Joanna, nephews Flavio, Camillo and niece Gloria who faithfully visited and cared for her together with our sisters in Italy.

She joined the congregation of the Sisters of Charity, on March 25, 1956, in Rome Italy. Seeing her desire to be missionary in 1957 she was sent to Argentina where she mastered her Spanish.

In 1961 she came to California, USA. She rendered her first service to the Oblates of St. Joseph at the minor seminary in Santa Cruz. In 1964 she made her perceptual vows at Santa Cruz. From 1967-2017 she served the Salinas valley communities with Catechetical Ministry and pastoral Care for the sick. Sr. Camilla will be remembered as a person of deep prayer and profound faith and humility. She is known for her simplicity and love for the poor, sick and the needy. She will be fondly remembered by all. May she Rest in Peace.

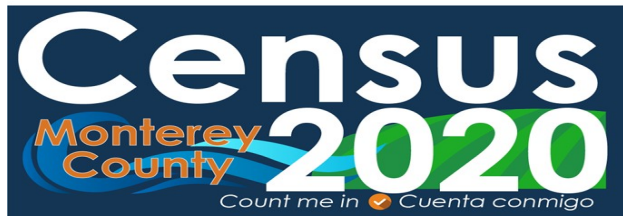
MISION PARROQUIAL

**Domingo de Ramos “De la Pasión del Señor”
5 de Abril del 2020**

¡HOSANNA!

“¡Viva el Hijo de David! ¡Bendito el que viene en el nombre del Señor! ¡Hosanna en el cielo!” (Mateo 21:9).
Con estas palabras la Iglesia entra en la semana más santa cuando conmemora la Pasión, Muerte y Resurrección de Cristo. Cuando el pueblo de Jerusalén gritó sus “hosannas”, estaba usando un antiguo grito de aclamación hebreo que significa “sálvanos ahora”. El rey a quien se lo gritaban los salvaría, pero de una manera que sobrepasó sus expectativas. La salvación vendría del madero de la cruz del cual colgaba Jesús para traer liberación del pecado y vida por medio de la muerte, abriendo las puertas del cielo para todos los que ponen su fe y confianza en él.—Copyright © J. TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

El Viernes Santo es el día más impresionante que se conmemora en el calendario cristiano. Es el día en que Jesús, muriendo en la cruz, se revela al mismo tiempo como Hijo del Hombre e Hijo de Dios. Los hispanos conmemoramos este día no sólo con la liturgia oficial de la Iglesia, sino también con nuestras devociones populares como el Vía crucis en vivo, el Pésame a la Virgen y el sermón de las Siete Palabras. Esta última devoción es también conocida como el Sermón de tres horas y es mayormente usada por las Iglesias protestantes, sin embargo, tiene su origen gracias al sacerdote Jesuita Francisco del Castillo, en Perú. Como Jesús, este santo varón dedicó toda su vida a los pobres y marginados. El Viernes Santo de 1660, mientras predicaba en la iglesia de Nuestra Señora de los Desamparados, ante la efigie del Señor en agonía, decidió hacer una comparación del sufrimiento de Cristo al sufrimiento de los desamparados, llamando a los cristianos al apostolado de caridad y justicia. Las siete últimas palabras de Jesucristo deben movernos al servicio de los desamparados.—
